General Rules

This show operates under the current USEF/WDAA Rules and Regulations

Dogs: NO DOGS ARE PERMITTED ON THE GROUNDS

Stallions: May not be exhibited by any youth or junior rider

CONDUCT: Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer or rider who has demonstrated unsportsmanlike behavior at an RRA event or to its Management.

Competition Tests: 2023 USEF/WDAA and current USEF/USDF Tests through Level 2. All Introductory and Basic Tests will be ridden in the short court. Current tests will be offered. Test of Choice Classes: There will be no changes to Test of Choice classes after entry closing date. WD Horsemanship patterns for each level will be posted by 8:00am

Judge's decision in all classes is final: No one shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain permission from the Show Secretary who will arrange an appointment at a proper place and time.

Attire and Tack: Refer to USEF WD rule book for specific show attire and tack. All Jr. riders must wear ASTM approved helmets.

NUMBERS: Exhibitors must appear in the ring with correct number on, clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Entries with incorrect or missing numbers may be eliminated.

Post Entries: Management reserves the right to accept post entries if space allows. There will be an additional post entry fee of \$10.00 per class.

Ride Times: A ride schedule will be emailed to each rider after the closing date. If ride times are not received, it is the responsibility of the rider/owner to contact Show Management. Any changes in Time Schedule will be posted outside the Show Office. Tentative start time will be 8:00 am

REFUNDS: Refunds BEFORE CLOSING day less \$10 Secretary fee. Refunds AFTER CLOSING DATE allowed only upon presentation of a veterinarian's or doctors certificate. Otherwise, no refunds of entries or stabling after closing date unless there is a waiting list for the stall/ride and the space can be filled from a waiting list at least 5 days prior to day of competition. A \$10 Secretary fee will be deducted from all refunds made after the closing date.

Services: No concessions on the grounds during show hours. Snacks available in the office daily. Restaurants within 10 minutes, Hotels within 20 minutes. Veterinarian and Farriers numbers will be posted in show office.

Show Office : Located inside the school indoor lounge. Open one hour prior to first class, and will close one-half hour after the last class. Barn chart: will be posted at the office and stalls will be marked.

Accuracy of Scores: It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of scores. Any scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary and/or the assistant within one hour of the last ridden test for that class. Failure to report any errors within the time allowed will mean that the error will not be corrected and there will be no change in class placing. **Tests Level 2 and above are not eligible for WDAA WHLPAP points.**

Cross Entry: No cross entry allowed from Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 11, 13 and any lope class for the same horse rider pair. Riders in WDAA classes may enter age division classes and Open division classes at the same show.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All riders under 18 must wear protective headgear (recommend for adults also) while riding in the designated schooling, exercise arenas and the show ring. Harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Awards: Awards to first for classes of three (3) entered exhibitors or more. Ribbons to five places. Divisions and High Percentage Awards: 1) Jr/Young Rider 2) Adult Amateur 3) Open. RIDERS MUST BE PRE-ENTERED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR HIGH PT. AWARDS. Freestyle test are not eligible for hi score awards. Online show awards will be mailed within 5 days of closing of show

Arenas: Tests will be ridden indoors, on geo-tex/sand footing. USDF/USEF WDAA Intro and Training/Basic classes will use 20M X 40M arena. All other tests will use a 20M X 60M outdoor arena with wood footing. There is a covered warm up arena.

Stabling is available at 30.00/night or day. Reserve in advance.

Camping: Dry camping is available at 20.00/night. Hookups 35.00/night

Closing date of entries: Five days before show date, unless the show becomes over-subscribed, in which case entries will be limited and will be accepted as received. Telephone/emailed entries will not be accepted. Any changes in entry require a new entry form. Management reserves the right to add a \$5 secretary fee for changes in schedule after ride times have been e-mailed.

Combination of Classes: The show management reserves the right to cancel or combine (where less than three horses are entered), or divide classes, or change order for award purposes. Classes listed will be scheduled at the discretion of the Show Management. Competitors will be notified of class schedule by e-mail. Competitors will be notified of any scheduling changes.

DIRECTIONS: From West: I 90 to Tyler Hwy exit to Cheney, right on Cheney/Spangle, Left on Curtis, Right on Anderson. **From East:** I 90 to Hwy 195 to Spokane Cheney Rd exit, Left on Sherman Rd, right on Anderson Rd. **From the North:** 395 S to I 90 W to Hwy 195 S. Take the Cheney/Spokane Rd exit. Left on Sherman Rd, right on Anderson Rd. **From the South:** Hwy 195 N. Take Paradise Rd to the left. Follow to Anderson Rd, turn left. Follow to farm. For trailer Parking, Go right on Short Rd

Every entry at this show shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that the person making it, owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, rider and the horse: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the association and the local rules of the show; (2) that every, horse, rider and/or handler is eligible as entered; (3) that the owner and any of his/her representatives are bound by the constitution and rules of USEF Western Dressage, RRA and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee and any question arising under said rules and agree to hold WDAA, RRA, their agents, officials, directors, employees and volunteers harmless for any action taken; (4) that the owner, rider/handler and any of their agents or representatives acknowledge that they participate voluntarily in the show, fully aware that horse sports and the show involve inherent dangerous risk, and by participating, they expressly assume any and all risks, injury, or loss, and they agree to hold the WDAA, RRA, their agents, officials, directors, employees and volunteers harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competition, whether or not such injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, agents or volunteers of these entities listed above. The laws of the State of Washington govern the construction or application of all rules.

Signature of parent, legal guardian, or authorized agent _____

Motorized vehicle statement: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

RELEASE, WAIVER, HOLD HARMLESS, DEFEND AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT
THIS DOCUMENT AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING

The undersigned, as a Participant/Spectator/Visitor/Horse Owner/Contractor/Volunteer (collectively “**Participant**”), on his/her own behalf and, if applicable, as the Parent/Legal Guardian of a minor Participant, for good and valuable consideration, agrees to the terms and conditions of this Release, Waiver, Hold Harmless, Defend, and Indemnification Agreement (“**Release**”).

1. Assumption of Risk and Waiver: Participant understands and accepts the risks of engaging in Equine Activities, while mounted or unmounted, as well as merely being near a horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinny (collectively “**equine**”), include, but are in no way limited to, faulty equipment or tack that cause injury or death, Released Parties’ failure to make a reasonable effort to determine the ability of Participant to engage safely in an equine activity or to safely manage the particular equine provided based on Participant’s representations of his or her ability, Released Parties’ failure to conspicuously post warning signs of a dangerous inconspicuous condition on the real property, as well as: (1) the propensity of an equine to behave in a way that may result in injury or death to a person on or near it (ex.: jump, run, kick, buck, bolt, spin, rear up, strike, bite, stumble, fall, etc.); (2) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to a sound (ex.: doors opening and closing, snow and ice falling, rain, wind, thunder, voices, music, guns, planes, cars, trucks, etc.), movement, or unfamiliar object (ex.: machinery, equipment, obstacles, buggies, carts, barrels, ground poles, cones, flowers, flags, golf carts, mini-bikes, whips, bats, construction material, etc.), person or animal (ex.: leashed or unleashed dogs, ducks, wildlife, equines, etc.); (3) a collision with an object or another animal (ex.: mounted equine, loose equine, etc.); (4) the potential for a person participating in an equine activity to act in a negligent manner, to fail to control the equine or to not act within his or her ability; and (5) natural hazards, including surface and subsurface conditions (ex.: ground holes, uneven terrain, slippery or deep footing, etc.). Participant agrees that engaging in Equine Activities under this Release includes, but is in no way limited to, those defined in the Washington Equine Activity Liability Statute, WA ST 4.24.530 *et seq.*, as well as riding another’s equine, petting, guiding, leading, mounting, feeding, watching, and otherwise interacting with or merely being in the vicinity of equines (collectively “**Equine Activities**”). Participant understands the injuries, death, loss, and damage that may result from the inherent risks of engaging in Equine Activities or just being near equines, that equines are powerful and have the potential to be dangerous, even without warning, and that the risks listed in this Release is just a sampling and Participant is not relying on Released Parties (defined below) to list all possible equine-related risks. Participant understands that USEF and WDAA requires the wearing of an ASTM/SEI-certified equestrian helmet (“**Helmet**”) consistent with the organization rules. Participant understands and agrees that failing to wear a Helmet while engaged in Equine Activities increases the risk of serious injury and/or death, Participant is not relying on Released Parties to provide a Helmet, check a Helmet or its harness strap for proper fitting, or monitor the wearing of a Helmet at any time now or in the future. Participant understands and agrees that Participant has other riding associations and facilities to choose from, he/she has inspected the facility for the Equine Activities and is satisfied that all are reasonable and safe for Participant’s intended use, he/she is voluntarily engaging in Equine Activities, he/she is directly and intentionally engaging in and assuming the risks of Equine Activities, and he/she agrees to at all times to be responsible for his/her personal safety. Participant agrees to purchase and maintain his/her health and liability insurance, remain responsible for his/her medical expenses, and waives his/her right to any claims arising from his/her participation in or observation of any Equine Activities, being near equines, or merely being present on real property owned, leased, rented, borrowed, visited, or otherwise occupied or utilized by Released Parties. “Released Parties” herein includes HEART, Relational Riding Academy, the USEF and WDAA, their members, officers, directors, employees, contractors, and their respective family members, heirs, agents, trustees, beneficiaries, employees, working students, volunteers, independent contractors, clinicians, guests, visitors, invitees, partners, members, managers, officers, directors, owners, lessors, lessees, licensors, licensees, and others acting on their behalf.

2. Release, Hold Harmless, Defend, Indemnify: Participant agrees to release, hold harmless, defend, and indemnify Released Parties for any illness, injury, death, damage, or other loss (collectively “**Loss**”) incurred by Participant or to Participant’s property and/or equine, even if such Loss is caused in whole or in part by negligence or other fault of Participant or Released Parties (except gross negligence, or reckless or willful and wanton conduct). This Release shall not expire and shall remain in full force and effect in perpetuity.

3. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, Time/Liability Limitation, Attorneys’ Fees, Jury Waiver: This Release shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington. All disputes relating to the interpretation and enforcement of this Release shall be resolved by the state court in Pierce County, Washington. Participant agrees that any and all claims for Loss by Participant against Released Parties must be brought within one (1) year of the date accrued and any surviving claim for personal property Loss is limited to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250). Participant agrees to reimburse Released Parties for any and all attorneys’ fees and costs incurred by Released Parties in enforcing the terms of this Release and/or in defending or prosecuting any claims or causes of action involving or relating to Participant. Participant agrees to waive trial by jury in any action with Released Parties.

4. Severability, Modification: If any provision of this Release is deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent of the law. The Release can only be modified if signed by Participant and WSH HSD Director.

5. Certification: Participant certifies he/she read this Release and understands that signing this Release is required for Participant to participate in Equine Activities with Released Parties, knows that he/she has other instructors, facilities and/or horses to choose from, and voluntarily intends on his/her own behalf, and on behalf of minor Participant, and Participant’s spouse, parents, family members, heirs, agents, trustees, beneficiaries, representatives, successors, and assigns, to be bound by the terms and conditions contained herein.
